### AN ACT MAKING THE MINIMUM FAIR WAGE FOR WOMEN AND MINORS EQUALLY APPLICABLE FOR MEN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The minimum fair wage for women and minors law  
2 is hereby made equally applicable to males twenty-  
3 one years of age and over, gainfully employed in any  
4 industry, trade or business or branch thereof, except  
5 domestic service in the home of the employer or labor  
6 on a farm, as if the title and wording of said law did  
7 not limit its application to women and minors.
