AN ACT PROVIDING FOR HEARINGS BEFORE THREE EXAMINERS OF THE BOARD OF REVIEW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section forty-one of chapter one hundred and
2 fifty-one A of the General Laws, as appearing in
3 section one of chapter six hundred and eighty-five
4 of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-one, is
5 hereby amended by striking out, in the fifth and sixth
6 lines, the words "one or more" and inserting in place
7 thereof the word:— three,—and by striking out,
8 in the eighth line, the words "any examiner" and
9 inserting in place thereof the word:— examiners,—
10 so that the second sentence of said section will read
11 as follows:— The board of review may appoint
12 three examiners, selected in accordance with sec-
13 tion nine K of chapter twenty-three, to conduct such
14 hearings, and the decision of examiners so appointed

15 shall be deemed to be the decision of the board of
16 review from the date of the filing thereof with the
17 director, unless the said board, on its own motion
18 or on application duly made to it, modifies or rescinds
19 such decision.
