AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALE OF "DAILY DOUBLE" TICKETS, SO CALLED, AT RACING MEETINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 "Daily double" tickets, so called, sold at any racing
2 meeting, shall be issued in such a manner that their
3 sale may be reflected in the calculations of the totalizer
4 or like machine in operation at said meeting, and the
5 awards or dividends thereon shall be calculated in the
6 same manner as awards or dividends for other wagers
7 there made.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Department

Section 1. The Legislative Department shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the State for a term of two years.

1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members elected by the electors of the State for a term of two years.
2. The electors in each county shall elect one member for each Representative District.
3. The electors in each city shall elect one member for each Representative District.
4. The electors in each town shall elect one member for each Representative District.
5. The electors in each ward shall elect one member for each Representative District.
6. The electors in each precinct shall elect one member for each Representative District.
7. The electors in each district shall elect one member for each Representative District.
