Lee for legislation to provide that service as a member of the General Court shall be counted as membership service in any retirement system of the Commonwealth or of any political subdivision thereof, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1390) of Francis E. Ryan and William F. Sullivan that the benefits of the Massachusetts retirement system be extended to members of the General Court and all constitutional officers, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 1656).

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY TO BE MADE BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO INVESTIGATE AND STUDY CERTAIN MATTERS RELATING TO THE NON-CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEMS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND CERTAIN POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS THEREOF.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission  
2 established by chapter eighty-nine of the resolves of  
3 nineteen hundred and forty-five for the purpose of  
4 making an investigation and study of certain matters  
5 relating to the non-contributory retirement systems  
6 of the commonwealth and certain political subdivi-  
7 sions thereof shall, in the course of its work, consider  
8 the subject matter of current senate document num-  
9 bered two hundred and fifty-five, relative to providing  
10 that service as a member of the general court shall  
11 be counted as membership service in any retirement  
12 system of the commonwealth or of any political sub-  
13 division thereof, and the subject matter of current  
14 house document numbered thirteen hundred and  
15 ninety, relative to extending the benefits of the  
16 Massachusetts retirement system to the members of  
17 the general court and all constitutional officers.
