AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PLACING OF THE OFFICE OF TOWN ACCOUNTANT OF THE TOWN OF HAMILTON UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The office of town accountant of the town of Hamil-
2 ton shall, upon the effective date of this act, become
3 subject to the civil service laws and rules and regula-
4 tions relating to town accountants in towns, and the
5 tenure of office of any incumbent thereof shall be
6 unlimited, subject, however, to said laws. The per-
7 son holding said office on said effective date shall be
8 subjected to a non-competitive qualifying examina-
9 tion by the division of civil service. If he passes said
10 examination, he shall be certified for said office and
11 shall be deemed to be permanently appointed thereto
12 without being required to serve any probationary
13 period. If he does not pass said examination, he may
14 continue to serve in said office, but shall not be
15 subject to said civil service laws.
