RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION RELATIVE TO THE EXTENSION OF THE WASHINGTON STREET TUNNEL IN THE CITY OF BOSTON TO SULLIVAN SQUARE, IN THE CHARLESTOWN DISTRICT OF BOSTON AND TO FOREST HILLS IN SAID CITY, AND THE REMOVAL OF THE EXISTING ELEVATED STRUCTURES.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission estab-
2 lished by chapter forty-one of the resolves of nineteen
3 hundred and forty-five shall, in the course of its work,
4 investigate the subject matter of current house docu-
5 ment numbered fifteen hundred and forty-three rela-
6 tive to the extension of the Washington street tunnel
7 in the city of Boston to Sullivan square, in the Charles-
8 town district of Boston and to Forest Hills in said city,
9 and the removal of the existing elevated structures.
10 Said commission shall include in its final report to the
11 general court the results of its investigation hereunder
12 and its recommendation in relation thereto.
