RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE COMMISSION ON ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE RELATIVE TO PROVIDING LIKE HOURS OF LABOR IN LIKE GRADES IN THE SERVICE OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the commission on administration
2 and finance is hereby directed to make an investiga-
3 tion relative to the various hours of employment of
4 persons of the same grade in the several departments,
5 divisions and institutions of the commonwealth, with
6 a view to establishing, so far as consistent with the
7 duties of the particular department, division or in-
8 stitution in which they work and with the office
9 hours maintained therein, uniform rules applicable to
10 all persons of the same grade. Said commission, in
11 making its investigation hereunder, shall consider the
12 subject matter of current house document numbered
13 four hundred and ninety-one, and shall report to the
14 general court the results of its investigation, includ-
15 ing information as to what action, by rule or other-
16 wise, if any, has been taken by it with respect to
17 such office hours, and its recommendations for further
18 action by rule or legislation, with respect thereto, by
19 filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
20 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday of De-
21 cember in the current year.
