RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE
ARMORY COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE ERECTION OF
NEW ARMORIES IN THE TOWNS OF BRAINTREE, BOURNE
AND SHARON.

1 *Resolved*, That the armory commission is hereby
2 authorized and directed to investigate the subject
3 matter of current senate document numbered two
4 hundred and seventy-eight, relative to the erection
5 of a new armory in the town of Bourne, the subject
6 matter of current house document numbered four
7 hundred and sixty-two, relative to the erection of a
8 new armory in the town of Braintree, and the subject
9 matter of current house document numbered four
10 hundred and sixty-three, relative to the erection of a
11 new armory in the town of Sharon. Said commission
12 shall report to the general court the results of its in-
13 vestigations hereunder, and its recommendations, if
14 any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to
15 carry said recommendations into effect, by filing the
16 same with the clerk of the house of representatives
17 on or before the first Wednesday of December in the
18 current year.
