AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE OF THE CITY OF BOSTON TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CHILD WELFARE DIVISION OF THE INSTITUTIONS DEPARTMENT OF SAID CITY TO ACT ALSO AS SUPERVISORS OF ATTENDANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The school committee of the city of Boston may
2 designate any male child-guidance social worker of
3 the child welfare division of the institutions depart-
4 ment of said city to act also as a supervisor of at-
5 tendance in said city; provided, that the person so
6 designated shall have previously passed an open com-
7 petitive civil service examination for the position of
8 such supervisor. Any such person shall exercise and
9 perform the powers and duties conferred and imposed
10 upon supervisors of attendance in said city by general
11 or special law, and shall receive such compensation for
12 acting as such supervisor as may be established by
13 said committee.
