### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WESTON TO BORROW MONEY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of acquiring and de-  
2 veloping land for schools, of constructing one or more  
3 school buildings and one or more additions to school  
4 buildings, and of originally equipping and furnishing  
5 such buildings and additions, or for any of such pur-  
6 poses, the town of Weston may borrow from time to  
7 time, within a period of five years from the passage of  
8 this act, such sums as may be necessary, not ex-  
9 ceeding, in the aggregate, six hundred thousand dollars,  
10 and may issue bonds or notes therefor, which shall  
11 bear on their face the words, Weston School Loan,  
12 Act of 1946. Each authorized issue shall constitute a  
13 separate loan, and such loans shall be paid in not  
14 more than twenty years from their dates. Indebted-  
15 ness incurred under this act shall be outside the

16 statutory limit, but shall, except as herein provided,  
 17 be subject to chapter forty-four of the General Laws,  
 18 including the requirement contained in the first  
 19 paragraph of section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
 2 passage.
