RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE A SURVEY AND STUDY OF THE POST-WAR PROBLEMS OF THE COMMONWEALTH RELATIVE TO ECONOMIC, HOUSING FACILITIES AND OTHER CONDITIONS.

1 *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission,
2 established by chapter eighty of the resolves of
3 nineteen hundred and forty-five, is hereby revived
4 and continued for the purpose of making a further
5 survey and study of such problems relative to eco-
6 nomic, housing facilities and other conditions as, in
7 the opinion of said commission, will have to be met
8 by the commonwealth upon the termination of the
9 present states of war between the United States and
10 certain foreign countries. Said commission shall
11 make a study of the economic resources within the
12 confines of the commonwealth, with a view to pro-
13 viding for a minimum of unemployment and a maxi-
14 mum opportunity for work for veterans and other
15 persons seeking employment. Said commission shall
16 also study measures for the assistance of Massa-
17 chusetts veterans, and shall study post-war problems
18 with reference to veterans' legislation. Said com-
19 mission, during its inquiry, shall have the assistance
20 and co-operation of the chairman of the commission

21 on administration and finance, the commissioner of
22 veterans' services and the chairman of the state
23 board of housing. Said commission shall be provided
24 with quarters in the state house, or elsewhere, and
25 may expend for necessary assistance and expenses
26 such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate,
27 dollars, as may hereafter be appropriated therefor.
28 The commission shall report to the general court the
29 results of its survey and study, and its recommenda-
30 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation neces-
31 sary to carry such recommendations into effect, by
32 filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
33 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday of De-
34 cember in the current year.
