AN ACT PROHIBITING THE POLLUTION OF THE ACUSHNET RIVER AND CLARK'S COVE IN NEW BEDFORD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting after section 175, as most recently
- 3 amended by chapter 353 of the acts of 1941, the
- 4 following section: -
- 5 Section 175A. The department is hereby author-
- 6 ized and directed to prohibit the entrance or dis-
- 7 charge of sewage into any part of the Acushnet river
- 8 and Clark's Cove in New Bedford, or their tribu-
- 9 taries, and to prevent the entrance or discharge therein
- 10 of any other substance which may be injurious to
- 11 public health or may tend to create a public nuisance
- 12 including all waste or refuse from any factory or
- 13 other establishment where persons are employed,
- 14 unless the owner thereof shall use the best practicable

15 and reasonably available means to render such waste 16 or refuse harmless.

The department shall consult and advise with the 18 owner of any factory or other establishment or any

19 municipality discharging any substance into said 20 Acushnet river and Clark's Cove, or their tributaries

21 at his or its request or of its own motion as to the

22 best practicable and reasonably available means of

23 rendering the waste or refuse therefrom harmless.

24 The supreme judicial court or any justice thereof, 25 and the superior court or any justice thereof, shall

26 have jurisdiction in equity to enforce the provisions

27 of this act and any order made by the department of

28 public health in conformity therewith. Proceedings 29 to enforce any such order shall be instituted and

30 prosecuted by the attorney-general upon the request

31 of the department of public health.

Whoever permits the entrance or discharge into 33 any part of the Acushnet river and Clark's Cove in 34 New Bedford, or their tributaries, of sewage or of 35 any other substance injurious to public health or 36 tending to create a public nuisance shall be punished 37 by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars for each

38 offence.
