The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL FROM CIVIL SERVICE OF THE OFFICE OF CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF WAYLAND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The office of the chief of police of the
2 town of Wayland shall no longer be subject to the
3 civil service laws and rules.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the
2 voters of the town of Wayland at the annual town
3 meeting in the current year in the form of the following
4 question, which shall be placed upon the official
5 ballot to be used for the election of town officers at
6 said meeting: — “Shall an act passed by the General
7 Court in the year nineteen hundred and forty-six,
8 entitled ‘An Act providing for the removal from civil
9 service of the office of chief of police of the town of
10 Wayland’, be accepted?” If a majority of the votes
11 in answer to said question is in the affirmative, then
12 this act shall thereupon take full effect, but not
13 otherwise.
