AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PLACING OF WILLIAM J. GIAL-
LONARDO, THE REGULAR POLICE OFFICER IN THE TOWN
OF MEDWAY, UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. William J. Giallonardo, the regular
2 police officer in the town of Medway shall, upon pass-
3 ing a noncompetitive qualifying examination to
4 which he shall be subjected by the division of civil
5 service, become subject to the civil service laws and
6 rules and regulations relating to permanent members
7 of police departments in towns, and his tenure of
8 office shall be unlimited, subject, however, to said
9 laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted for ac-
2 ceptance to the voters of said town at the annual
3 town meeting in the current year in the form of the

4 following question, which shall be placed upon the
5 official ballot to be used for the election of town officers
6 at said meeting: "Shall an act passed by the General
7 Court in the year nineteen hundred and forty-seven,
8 entitled 'An Act authorizing the placing of William
9 J. Giallonardo, the Regular Police Officer in the Town
10 of Medway, under the Civil Service Laws', be ac-
11 cepted?" If a majority of the votes in answer to said
12 question is in the affirmative, then this act shall
13 thereupon take full effect, but not otherwise.
