In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATING TO RECORDS IN THE DISTRICT COURTS WHICH THE ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DISTRICT COURTS MAY REQUIRE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 43A of chapter 218 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by chapter 101 of the acts
3 of 1943, is hereby further amended by striking out
4 the sixth sentence of the first paragraph thereof and
5 inserting in place thereof the following new sentence:
6 —Without limiting the generality of the foregoing,
7 the committee may require records to be kept which
8 shall be available to the general court and which shall
9 show the hours of opening and adjourning of court
10 and any simultaneous session thereof on each day,
11 the names of the justices and special justices holding
12 court or a simultaneous session thereof, and any other
13 information which may generally assist in the deter-
14 mination of the nature and volume of, and the time
15 required to complete, all work done by any of such
16 district courts.
