By Mrs. Cutler of Needham, petition of Leslie Bradley Cutler that the Boston Elevated Railway Company be granted the right to operate in the city of Boston motor vehicles for the carriage of passengers for hire over a certain route to and from the General Edward Lawrence Logan Airport. AN ACT GRANTING TO THE BOSTON ELEVATED RAILWAY COMPANY THE RIGHT TO OPERATE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON MOTOR VEHICLES FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS FOR HIRE OVER A CERTAIN ROUTE TO AND FROM THE GENERAL EDWARD LAWRENCE LOGAN AIRPORT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. So long as the Boston Elevated Rail-
2 way Company is publicly managed and operated, it
3 may, without complying with section seven of chapter
4 one hundred and fifty-nine A of the General Laws
5 but otherwise subject to the provisions of said chap-
6 ter one hundred and fifty-nine A, except section four
7 thereof, operate motor vehicles in the city of Boston
8 for the purpose of carrying passengers for hire between
9 Copley square and the General Edward Lawrence
10 Logan Airport, over the route set forth in a license
11 granted by the mayor and city council of said city to

12 said company on September twenty-fifth, nineteen
 13 hundred and forty-five, or over said route as it may
 14 be altered by the mayor and city council thereof pur-
 15 suant to a petition of said company, and subject to
 16 the conditions set forth in said license or altered license.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
 2 passage.

Section 1. The Commission of State Affairs is hereby
 authorized to investigate and report to the Governor
 and the Legislature on the administration of the
 State of New York.

Section 2. The Commission of State Affairs is hereby
 authorized to employ such personnel as it may deem
 necessary for the proper discharge of its duties.
 Section 3. The Commission of State Affairs is hereby
 authorized to receive and accept of any person or
 corporation any sum of money or other thing of
 value for the purpose of defraying the expenses
 of the Commission of State Affairs.
