AN ACT REVIVING THE LAW PROVIDING FOR PARTY
PRIMARIES AND PRE-PRIMARY CONVENTIONS OF POLI-
TICAL PARTIES, AND REPEALING CERTAIN OTHER LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 All provisions of chapter three hundred and ten
2 of the acts of nineteen hundred and thirty-two,
3 providing for party primaries and for pre-primary
4 conventions, and all other laws relative to such
5 primaries or to such conventions, or to both, which
6 were repealed by section one of chapter three hundred
7 and eighty-four of the acts of nineteen hundred and
8 thirty-seven, are hereby revived. All provisions of
9 the election law enacted since the repeal of said laws
10 which are inconsistent with the provisions of law
11 revived as aforesaid are hereby repealed.
