In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II AS PHARMACISTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 272 of the acts of 1946 is hereby
2 amended by striking out, in lines 12 o 14, inclusive,
3 the words:— ; provided, that he is a graduate of a
4 school or college of pharmacy approved by said
5 board and the United States Veterans Administra-
6 tion,— so as to read as follows:— *Section 1.* The
7 provisions of section twenty-four of chapter one hun-
8 dred and twelve of the General Laws, as most recently
9 amended by section one of chapter five hundred and
10 two of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-five,
11 which provide that an applicant for registration as a
12 pharmacist shall be a graduate of a school or college
13 of pharmacy approved by the board of registration in
14 pharmacy and the commissioner of education, upon
15 such provisions becoming effective, shall not apply
16 to a person who shall have served in the armed forces
17 of the United States during World War II and shall
18 have received a discharge or release, other than a dis-
19 honorable one, from such service.
