In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO NIGHT LABOR FOR WOMEN OVER TWENTY-ONE IN MANUFACTURING AND MECHANICAL ESTABLISHMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by striking out section 59, as amended by section 1
- 3 of chapter 170 of the acts of 1936, and inserting in
- 4 place thereof the following: —
- 5 *Section 59.* No person, and no agent or officer of
- 6 a person, shall employ a female in any capacity in
- 7 manufacturing or mechanical establishments before
- 8 six o'clock in the morning or after ten o'clock in the
- 9 evening, except that in any such establishment which
- 10 operates on multiple shifts, a woman over twenty-one
- 11 may be employed until twelve midnight. No person,
- 12 and no agent or officer of a person, shall employ a
- 13 female in any capacity in the manufacture of textile
- 14 goods or leather after six o'clock in the evening.
- 15 Whoever violates any provision of this section shall
- 16 be punished by a fine of not less than twenty nor
- 17 more than fifty dollars.
