AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS THAT HAVE ACCEPTED CHAPTER FIVE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-SIX OF THE ACTS OF NINETEEN HUNDRED AND FORTY-SIX TO RETIRE VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SAID CHAPTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 In any city or town that has accepted chapter five
2 hundred and seventy-six of the acts of nineteen hun-
3 dred and forty-six, any member of the fire department
4 who is a veteran of World War II and who is a member
5 of the contributory retirement system of said city or
6 town may withdraw from said system and shall there-
7 upon be paid the amount of his accumulated deduc-
8 tions and shall be entitled, or restored, as the case
9 may be, to all rights and privileges under said chapter
10 five hundred and seventy-six.
