MEMORANDUM OF COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION PURSUANT TO GENERAL LAWS, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 7, AS AMENDED, WITH RESPECT TO PETITION OF HAROLD B. BELCHER AND OTHERS FOR LEGISLATION RELATIVE TO THE NUMBER OF TRUSTEES IN THE CORPORATION CALLED THE TRUSTEES OF ANATOLIA COLLEGE.

JANUARY 21, 1947.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the House, January 10, 1947.

The Trustees of Anatolia College was created a corporation by chapter 106 of the Acts of 1894. For an amendment of the act of incorporation, see chapter 230 of the Acts of 1922.

The purpose of the present bill appears to be to increase the maximum number of trustees authorized. In my opinion the object can only be accomplished by an act of the Legislature.

No fee is required by General Laws, chapter 3, section 7, in the case of a corporation of this kind.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE NUMBER OF TRUSTEES IN THE CORPORATION CALLED THE TRUSTEES OF ANATOLIA COLLEGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 106 of the Acts of 1894, as
2 amended by section 1 of chapter 230 of the Acts of
3 1922, is hereby further amended by striking out the
4 last sentence and inserting in place thereof the fol-
5 lowing:—The trustees shall number not less than
6 nine nor more than thirty-six and shall be divided into
7 three approximately equal classes; one class to serve
8 for three years, one class to serve for two years, and
9 one class to serve for one year, and at the expiration
10 of the several terms their successors shall be chosen
11 in classes for terms of three years each.
