AN ACT AMENDING THE LAW RELATIVE TO THE CRIME OF LARCENY IN CONNECTION WITH THE BREAKING, BURNING, BLOWING UP OR OTHERWISE INJURING OR DESTROYING A SAFE, VAULT OR OTHER DEPOSITORY OF MONEY, BONDS OR OTHER VALUABLES IN ANY BUILDING OR PLACE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws, section 21, is
2 hereby amended by striking out the words "or at-
3 tempts to or does break, burn, blow up or otherwise
4 injure or destroy a safe, vault or other depository of
5 money, bonds or other valuables in any building or
6 place",—where they appear in said section, and
7 inserting in place thereof the following:— or by in-
8 timidation, force or threats attempts to or does break,
9 burn, blow up or otherwise injure or destroy a safe,
10 vault or other depository of money, bonds or other
11 valuables in any building or place.
