AN ACT PROVIDING THAT NO STATE TAX SHALL BE ASSESSED
UPON THE CITIES AND TOWNS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, no state tax shall be assessed upon the cities and towns of the commonwealth.
