AN ACT REGULATING THE COMPENSATION OF THE AUCTIONEER IN THE OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF REAL ESTATE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF BOSTON AND RELATIVE TO THE SALE OF PROPERTY OWNED BY SAID CITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 652 of the acts of 1945 is  
2 hereby amended by striking out section 2 and insert-  
3 ing in place thereof the two following sections:—

4 *Section 2.* The incumbent of said position of auc-  
5 tioneer shall receive for his services the fees established  
6 from time to time for auctioneers by the Boston real  
7 estate board, provided that he shall not receive as  
8 compensation as such auctioneer more than ten thou-  
9 sand dollars in any calendar year.

10 *Section 2A.* Notwithstanding any provision of gen-  
11 eral or special law to the contrary, no real estate ac-  
12 quired by said city by foreclosure of tax titles or  
13 otherwise shall be sold except by said auctioneer at  
14 public auction.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
