AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF ASHBURNHAM TO
BORROW MONEY FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of constructing an
2 addition to the Dolly Whitney Adams School and
3 originally furnishing and equipping said addition, the
4 town of Ashburnham may borrow from time to time,
5 within a period of five years from the effective date of
6 this act, such sums of money as may be necessary, not
7 exceeding, in the aggregate, seventy-five thousand
8 dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor, which
9 shall bear on their face the words, Ashburnham School
10 Loan, Act of 1947. Each authorized issue shall con-
11 stitute a separate loan, and such loans shall be paid in
12 not more than twenty years from their dates. In-
13 debtedness incurred under this act shall be in excess of
14 the statutory limit, but shall, except as provided
15 herein, be subject to chapter forty-four of the General
16 Laws, exclusive of the limitation contained in the first
17 paragraph of section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
