AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES AND TOWNS WHICH PROVIDE AN EXTENDED COURSE OF INSTRUCTION ON JUNIOR COLLEGE LEVEL FOR VETERANS AND OTHERS TO USE THE DESIGNATION "JUNIOR COLLEGE" IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the con-
2 trary, any city or town which conducts an extended
3 course of instruction on junior college level for veterans
4 and others, under the provisions of chapter five hun-
5 dred and thirty-two of the acts of nineteen hundred
6 and forty-six, may use the designation "junior
7 college"; provided, that such designation shall relate
8 to a school only with respect to the conduct thereat
9 of such an extended course of instruction.
