The committee on Metropolitan Affairs, to whom were referred so much of the message from His Excellency the Governor recommending legislation necessary to cover certain matters presently included within the scope of the war-time powers of the Governor after the termination of such powers (House, No. 1785) as relates to authorizing the Metropolitan District Commission to continue to furnish water to the General Electric Company in Lynn and to the Murphy General Hospital in Waltham, and as relates to authorizing the Bethlehem-Hingham Shipyard to discharge its sewage into the sewerage system of the Metropolitan District Commission, reports the accompanying bill (House, No. 1911).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Seven.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONTINUE CERTAIN CONTRACTS ENTERED INTO WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, THE GENERAL ELECTRIC COMPANY AND THE BETHLEHEM-HINGHAM SHIPYARD, INC.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission  
2 is hereby authorized to continue to furnish water  
3 until March thirty-first, nineteen hundred and forty-  
4 eight, to the Murphy General Hospital in Waltham  
5 under the terms of a contract with the United States  
6 of America dated January twentieth, nineteen hundred  
7 and forty-four, and to the General Electric Company,  
8 its successors or assigns, at Lynn under the terms  
9 of a contract dated April sixth, nineteen hundred  
10 and forty-three, and to continue to furnish sewage  
11 disposal facilities until March thirty-first, nineteen  
12 hundred and forty-eight, to the Bethlehem-Hingham  
13 Shipyard, Inc., its successors or assigns, at Hingham  
14 under the terms of a contract dated February eleventh,  
15 nineteen hundred and forty-three, all of said contracts  
16 having been entered into under the authority of  
17 Executive Order No. 24, dated June nineteenth,  
18 nineteen hundred and forty-two, and Executive

19 Order No. 43, dated December fifth, nineteen hundred  
20 and forty-two, issued under the emergency war-time  
21 powers of the governor.

1 SECTION 2. The said commission, with the ap-  
2 proval of the governor, is hereby authorized to enter  
3 into such other contracts with the United States of  
4 America, the General Electric Company and the  
5 Bethlehem-Hingham Shipyard, Inc., their successors  
6 or assigns, to furnish water or sewage disposal facili-  
7 ties as it may deem necessary, but in no event shall  
8 the termination date of any contract be later than  
9 March thirty-first, nineteen hundred and forty-eight.

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
