Quigley, commander, and others, for legislation to limit the transfer of certain plates issued by the Department of Public Utilities to common carriers, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. of 403) of Charles W. Olson, Edward M. Rowe and Norman F. Wellen for legislation to regulate the transfer of certain distinguishing plates to carriers of property by motor vehicle, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 187) of Jacinto F. Diniz that provisions of law requiring hearings and notices of hearings upon applications for certain certificates and permits by carriers of property by motor vehicle be made inapplicable to such carriers who are veterans of World War II, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1251) of Thomas F. Reilly and John Henry Carroll that provisions of law requiring hearings and notices of hearings upon applications for certificates and permits by carriers of property by motor vehicle be made inapplicable to such carriers who are veterans of World War II, report the accompanying resolve (House, No. 2010).

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF THE TRANSFER OF CERTAIN DISTINGUISHING PLATES ISSUED TO CARRIERS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES, AND THE ISSUANCE BY SAID DEPARTMENT OF CERTAIN CERTIFICATES AND PERMITS TO VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of one member of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof and three persons to be appointed by the gov-
6 ernor, is hereby established for the purpose of investi-
7 gating the subject matter of current senate documents
8 numbered four hundred and four hundred and three,
9 relative to the regulation of the transfer of certain dis-
10 tinguishing plates issued to carriers by the department
11 of public utilities, and of current house documents
12 numbered one hundred and eighty-seven and twelve
13 hundred and fifty-one, relative to the issuance by said
14 department of certain certificates and permits to vet-
15 erans of World War II. Said commission may expend
16 for clerical and other services and expenses, such sums,
17 not exceeding, in the aggregate, dollars, as
18 may hereafter be appropriated therefor. Said com-
19 mission shall report to the general court the results of

20 its investigation, and its recommendations, if any,
21 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
22 its recommendations into effect, by filing the same
23 with the clerk of the house of representatives on or
24 before the first Wednesday of December in the current
25 year.
