## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

### AN ACT PLACING THE OFFICE OF SENIOR LEGAL ASSISTANT OF THE APPELLATE TAX BOARD UNDER THE CIVIL SERVICE LAWS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 The office of senior legal assistant of the appellate  
2 tax board shall, upon the effective date of this act,  
3 become subject to the civil service laws and rules, and  
4 the tenure of office of each incumbent thereof shall  
5 be unlimited, subject, however, to said laws, but each  
6 of the persons holding said office immediately prior  
7 to said effective date shall be subjected by the division  
8 of civil service to a non-competitive qualifying ex-  
9 amination, and upon passing said examination shall  
10 be certified for said office and shall be deemed to be  
11 permanently appointed thereto without being re-  
12 quired to serve any probationary period.
