AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENTS BY THE COMMONWEALTH
IN REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COST OF CERTAIN SHORE
PROTECTIVE WORK IN THE TOWN AND COUNTY OF
BARNSTABLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the con-
2 trary, the amount of reimbursements to be paid by
3 the commonwealth under the provisions of chapter
4 seven hundred and thirty-four of the acts of nineteen
5 hundred and forty-five shall not exceed eighty
6 thousand dollars, and such reimbursements shall be
7 restricted to the work of building structures to protect
8 the coast line from damage by the sea, which work
9 was undertaken or contracted for after September
10 fourteenth, nineteen hundred and forty-four, and
11 prior to July twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and
12 forty-five, and was completed prior to December
13 thirty-first, nineteen hundred and forty-six.
