AN ACT TO PROVIDE PENSIONS FOR CERTAIN STATE EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of promoting the public good and
2 in consideration of long and meritorious service, any
3 person employed by the commonwealth on a tem-
4 porary, temporary-provisional, temporary-recurrent,
5 part-time or seasonal basis and having completed
6 continuous or intermittent service of not less than one
7 hundred and twenty months in the fifteen year period
8 prior to July first, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight,
9 who, because of having attained age fifty-five before
10 said date, was not eligible to become a member of the
11 state retirement system, shall, on retirement, after
12 having been in the employ of the commonwealth for
13 not less than twenty-five years and after having
14 attained the age of seventy, receive from the com-
15 monwealth for the remainder of his life the sum of
16 ten dollars per week.
