AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF LAW RELATING TO COMPRESSED AIR TANKS INAPPLICABLE TO CERTAIN RECEPTACLES USED IN THE LIFTING OF AUTOMOBILES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 34 of chapter 146 of the General Laws, as  
2 amended by section 1 of chapter 319 of the acts of  
3 1938, is hereby further amended by adding at the end  
4 the following sentence: — This section shall be in-  
5 applicable in case of the installation or use of a  
6 receptacle temporarily holding oil and air and used for  
7 the purpose of lifting automobiles, but only if said  
8 receptacle is approved by the board as being of a  
9 type which conforms to recognized standards of  
10 engineering practice as such standards apply to  
11 receptacles designed for such purpose and as meet-  
12 ing the requirements of regulations referred to in  
13 section thirty-five which regulations are hereby made  
14 applicable to such receptacles for this purpose.
