AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF THE CITY

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

2 trary notwithstanding, the city messenger of the city
3 of Holyoke in office upon the effective date of this act
4 may, upon his written request, be retired under the
5 provisions of sections seventy-seven to seventy-nine,
6 inclusive, of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws,
7 commonly known as the laborers' pension law.
