AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WESTON TO RETIRE AND PENSION JOHN J. CASSIDY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of promoting the public good and
2 in consideration of meritorious service the town of
3 Weston and the Retirement Board of Middlesex
4 county may pension and retire John J. Cassidy, a
5 policeman of Weston, who sustained serious and
6 permanent injuries while in the performance of his
7 duties as a police officer of said town. In order to
8 permit such retirement the town of Weston and the
9 retirement board of Middlesex county are hereby
10 authorized to apply the provisions of sections one to
11 twenty-eight inclusive of chapter thirty-two of the
12 General Laws as fully and completely as if said pro-
13 visions had been accepted by the town of Weston prior
14 to the date said John J. Cassidy was injured.
