RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO FURTHER REGULATING THE SERVICE OF CIVIL PROCESS ON NON-RESIDENT DEFENDANTS.

1 *Resolved*, That the judicial council be requested to
2 investigate the subject matter of current house docu-
3 ment numbered thirteen hundred and thirty-seven
4 relative to further regulating the service of process in
5 civil cases, and to include its conclusions and recom-
6 mendations in relation thereto, with drafts of such
7 legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the
8 same, in its annual report for the current year.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
