## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A STUDY BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE TITLES TO THE SEVERAL PARCELS OF LAND COMPRISING THE GREYLOCK STATE RESERVATION.

1 *Resolved*, That the department of conservation, under  
2 the direction of the attorney general, is hereby directed  
3 to investigate and examine the titles to the various  
4 parcels of land acquired by gift, purchase or other-  
5 wise for the Greylock state reservation for the purpose  
6 of ascertaining whether any part of such land is held  
7 subject to any condition, trust or restriction which  
8 would make invalid any legislation purporting to  
9 grant the right to hunt birds and mammals, or to  
10 fish, and in this connection shall consider the subject  
11 matter of current house document numbered four  
12 hundred and eighty. For the purposes of this resolve  
13 the Greylock reservation commission shall allow the  
14 said department and the attorney general to examine  
15 all deeds and documents in its possession relating to  
16 the titles of such land. For the purpose of the exam-  
17 ination of titles to land said commission may expend  
18 not exceeding two hundred dollars to be paid from  
19 the inland fisheries and game fund. Said department  
20 shall report to the general court the result of its study  
21 and its recommendations, if any, for legislation, by  
22 filing such report with the clerk of the senate on or  
23 before the first Wednesday of December in the current  
24 year.
