## The Commonwealth of Wassachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO A FURTHER STAY OF JUDGMENT AND EXECUTION IN ACTIONS OF SUMMARY PROCESS.

- 1 Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would
- 2 tend in part to defeat its purpose, which is to provide
- 3 the courts with further discretionary authority to pre-
- 4 vent serious hardships in eviction cases arising out of
- 5 the present severe housing shortage, therefore it is
- 6 hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary
- 7 for the immediate preservation of the welfare of the 8 public.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 43 of the acts of
- 2 1946, as amended by section 1 of chapter 78 of the acts
- 3 of 1947, is hereby further amended by striking out,
- 4 in line 5, the word "four" and inserting in place thereof
- 5 the word: six, so as to read as follows: Sec-
- 6 tion 1. So long as this act continues in force, a stay
- 7 of judgment and execution may be granted under

- 8 sections nine to thirteen, inclusive, of chapter two hun-
- 9 dred and thirty-nine of the General Laws, for a period
- 10 not exceeding six months instead of one month as now
- 11 provided by section nine of said chapter.
  - 1 Section 2. Said chapter 43 is hereby further
- 2 amended by striking out section 2, as amended by
- 3 section 2 of said chapter 78, and inserting in place
- 4 thereof the following: -
- 5 Section 2. This act shall become inoperative on
- 6 March thirty-first, nineteen hundred and forty-nine.
