RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE DEFINITION OF THE RIGHTS OF VETERANS EMPLOYED BY THE MET- ROPOLITAN TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid commission, to consist of
2 one member of the senate to be designated by the
3 president thereof, three members of the house of rep-
4 resentatives to be designated by the speaker thereof
5 and three persons to be appointed by the governor
6 one of whom shall be an employee of the metropolitan
7 transit authority, is hereby established for the pur-
8 pose of investigating and studying the advisability of
9 establishing the same rights to the veterans now em-
10 ployed by the metropolitan transit authority as apply
11 to veterans employed in other state departments.

12 Said commission may expend for clerical and other
13 services and expenses, such sums, not exceeding in
14 the aggregate, dollars, as may hereafter
15 be appropriated therefor.

16 Said commission shall report to the general court the
 17 results of its investigation and study, and its recom-
 18 mendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation
 19 necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by
 20 filing the same with the clerk of the house of repre-
 21 sentatives on or before the first Wednesday of De-
 22 cember in the current year.
