

HOUSE No. 844

By Mr. Curley of Springfield, petition of John G. Curley for legislation to regulate the appointment and service of persons supervising apprentice training or "on the job" training of veterans. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Eight.

AN ACT REGULATING THE APPOINTMENT AND SERVICE OF PERSONS SUPERVISING OR DIRECTING APPRENTICE TRAINING, OR "ON THE JOB" TRAINING, OF VETERANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 No person shall be appointed to or hold any posi-
2 tion the duties of which include the supervision or
3 direction of any veteran taking advantage of the
4 benefits of the G. I. Bill of Rights, so called, relating
5 to apprentice training, or "on the job" training,
6 unless he is himself a veteran, nor unless his release
7 or discharge from the armed forces of the United
8 States was under conditions other than dishonorable.

The Government of the District of Columbia
