### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF CERTAIN VETERANS OF WORLD WAR II AS PHARMACISTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 1 of chapter 272 of the acts of 1946 is hereby  
2 amended by adding at the end the words: — , except  
3 that any such veteran who is eligible to take the ex-  
4 amination for such registration during the year nine-  
5 teen hundred and forty-eight shall also be eligible to  
6 take such examination during the year nineteen hun-  
7 dred and forty-nine without being a graduate of such  
8 an approved school or college of pharmacy, — so as  
9 to read as follows: — *Section 1.* The provisions of  
10 section twenty-four of chapter one hundred and  
11 twelve of the General Laws, as most recently amended  
12 by section one of chapter five hundred and two of the  
13 acts of nineteen hundred and forty-five, which pro-  
14 vide that an applicant for registration as a pharma-  
15 cist shall be a graduate of a school or college of phar-

16 macy approved by the board of registration in phar-  
17 macy and the commissioner of education, upon such  
18 provisions becoming effective, shall not apply to a  
19 person who shall have served in the armed forces of  
20 the United States during World War II and shall have  
21 received a discharge or release, other than a dis-  
22 honorable one, from such service; provided, that he  
23 is a graduate of a school or college of pharmacy ap-  
24 proved by said board and the United States Veterans  
25 Administration, except that any such veteran who is  
26 eligible to take the examination for such registration  
27 during the year nineteen hundred and forty-eight shall  
28 also be eligible to take such examination during the  
29 year nineteen hundred and forty-nine without being  
30 a graduate of such an approved school or college of  
31 pharmacy.
