AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF LAW RELATING TO COMPRESSED AIR TANKS INAPPLICABLE TO OPERATING HYDRAULIC MACHINERY OR SIMILAR APPARATUS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 34 of chapter 146 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the last sentence, as  
3 appearing in chapter 620 of the acts of 1947, and in-  
4 serting in place thereof the following: — This section  
5 shall be inapplicable in case of the installation or use  
6 of a receptacle temporarily holding oil and air and  
7 used for the purpose of lifting automobiles, operating  
8 hydraulic machinery or similar apparatus, but only if  
9 said receptacle is approved by the board as being of a  
10 type which conforms to recognized standards of en-  
11 gineering practice as such standards apply to recep-  
12 tacles designed for such purpose and as meeting the  
13 requirements of regulations referred to in section  
14 thirty-five which regulations are hereby made appli-  
15 cable to such receptacles for this purpose.
