AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE STATUS OF CERTAIN WOMEN TEACHERS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Any of the General Laws or Special Laws relating
2 to the city of Boston, or any rule or regulation of the
3 commonwealth or of any department or agency of the
4 city of Boston to the contrary notwithstanding, it
5 shall not be grounds to dismiss, demote, penalize or
6 otherwise affect the status of any woman teacher
7 employed in or by the public school system of Boston
8 for the reason that she has become, or is, married.
