AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DREDGING OF THE OUTER CHANNEL IN WYCHMERE HARBOR IN THE TOWN OF HARWICH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The department of public works is hereby author-  
2 ized and directed to dredge the outer channel in  
3 Wychmere harbor in the town of Harwich. For said  
4 purposes, said department may expend such sums as  
5 may hereafter be appropriated therefor, and one half  
6 of the cost of said work shall be assessed upon the  
7 town of Harwich.
