RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF LEO J. DUMAS OF LEOMINSTER.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging the
2 moral obligation of the commonwealth, and subject
3 to appropriation, there be allowed and paid from the
4 state treasury to Leo J. Dumas of Leominster, who
5 was injured and permanently disabled in the year
6 nineteen hundred and thirty-five, while in the per-
7 formance of duty as a patrolman in the uniformed
8 division of the state police, the sum of five thousand
9 dollars on the passage of this resolve, and the further
10 sum of one thousand and eighty dollars a year for five
11 years thereafter. Said reimbursement shall be ex-
12 empted from all taxes imposed by the commonwealth
13 or by any other government in so far as this common-
14 wealth may so provide. No payment shall be made
15 hereunder until there shall have been filed with the
16 comptroller an agreement signed by said Leo J. Dumas
17 that the amount, if any, paid or to be paid for legal
18 services rendered in connection with the passage of
19 this resolve shall not exceed ten per cent of the amounts
20 paid or payable hereunder.
