AN ACT GRANTING TO CONSERVATION OFFICERS OF THE DIVISION OF FISHERIES AND GAME CERTAIN EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS WHICH THEY FAILED TO RECEIVE ALTHOUGH ENTITLED THERETO.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Every conservation officer of the division of fish-  
2 eries and game of the department of conservation  
3 who, during the period beginning October seventh,  
4 nineteen hundred and forty-five and ending June  
5 thirtieth, nineteen hundred and forty-seven, was re-  
6 quired to work upon any of the holidays listed in  
7 section twenty-four A of chapter thirty of the General  
8 Laws, shall forthwith be paid an additional day's pay  
9 for each of said holidays on which he was required to  
10 work.
