AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF WEBSTER TO INCUR INDEBTEDNESS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SEWAGE DISPOSAL WORKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of constructing sewage
2 disposal works, the town of Webster may, from time
3 to time, within five years after the passage of this
4 act, borrow such sums as may be necessary, not
5 exceeding in the aggregate nine hundred and fifty
6 thousand dollars, and may issue bonds and notes
7 therefor which shall bear on the face thereof the
8 words, Webster Sewage Disposal Loan, Acts of 1948.
9 Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate
10 loan, and such loans shall be payable in not more
11 than thirty years from their dates. Indebtedness
12 incurred under this act shall be in excess of the statu-
13 tory limit, and shall be subject to the provisions of
14 chapter forty-four of the General Laws, including
15 the first paragraph of section seven thereof.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
