Ordered, That the committee on counties on the part of the House is hereby authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of studying matters pertaining to county affairs and county finance, and in the discharge of its duties hereunder, said committee may travel within the Commonwealth particularly for the purpose of inspecting jails and houses of correction, hospitals, agricultural schools, training schools and other institutions maintained by the counties. For the purposes of this order, said committee may expend such sums not exceeding, in the aggregate, twelve hundred dollars as may be hereafter appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the House the results of its study, and its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House not later than the fifteenth day of December in the current year.
