AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN INCREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF PAYMENTS OF VETERANS' BENEFITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The commissioner of veterans' services shall pre-
- 2 pare a schedule of payments of veterans' benefits
- 3 which shall be furnished to the persons authorized to
- 4 disburse veterans' benefits in cities and towns. Such
- 5 schedule shall provide for an increase in the amount
- 6 of payments which the commissioner will allow as
- 7 reimbursement by the commonwealth to the cities
- 8 and towns for payments of veterans' benefits.

The Commission on the Department of
