AN ACT MAKING CERTAIN REGISTERED DENTISTS ELIGIBLE TO ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would
2 tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make available
3 forthwith to certain residents of the commonwealth
4 the opportunity to practice dentistry, therefore it is
5 hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary
6 for the immediate preservation of the public con-
7 venience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provision of section
2 three of chapter four hundred and fifteen of the acts
3 of nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, any resident of
4 the commonwealth who received a certificate of reg-
5 istration from the board of dental examiners prior to
6 January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, may
7 practice dentistry in the commonwealth; provided,
8 that no such certificate, or renewal thereof, has been
9 cancelled or revoked. Such practice shall be subject
10 to and have the benefit of all other pertinent provi-
11 sions of law relating to the registration of dentists
12 and the practice of dentistry in the commonwealth.
