AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF THE COUNSEL TO THE SENATE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The counsel to the senate in office on the effective
2 date of this act may become a member of the state
3 retirement system by depositing in the annuity
4 savings fund of said system the sum of one thousand
5 dollars. Thereafter, upon reaching the maximum age
6 for his group, he shall receive from the commonwealth
7 a retirement allowance or pension of twenty-four
8 hundred dollars per annum.
